Selling will continue to mid-March with Crape Myrtles and white dogwoods being the greater inventory. The club is again indebted to Harold Hatcher for leading the tree bank operation which produces these trees. There is an ongoing need for member volunteers to participate in this work. It is both good therapy and a horticulture learning experience. We salute members Winston Hardegree, Tom Prince, Ben DeLuca, Harold Browning for their help with tree bank work. Helpers at the sales end have been Walter Soderberg, Joe Maple, Tom Bartram, Jack Turner, Jess Taylor, and John Nevison. A work schedule — sign up chart is proposed for the 820 Reidville Rd. work center. We want to acknowledge all participants.

Observation Deck at Hatcher Gardens — A contract has been signed with "Arch A Deck" to build an approximately 20" x 24" observation deck overlooking a bank, pond and waterfall in Hatcher Horticulture Gardens. This is a joint venture shared by the Women's Garden Club Council, our club and the Spartanburg County Foundation. Our Jess Taylor is the project manager. While the deck construction progresses as weather permits January and February, a dedication program is anticipated in April.

Observation Deck at Hatcher Horticulture Gardens. The approximate 20'x24' deck at Hatcher Gardens has been completed and a preservative coating applied. Your club, the Ladies' Garden Council and the Spartanburg Foundation have covered its cost; our Treasurer, Jess Taylor has been the project leader and designer working with the builders "ARCHADECK." The dedication ceremony date, planned for April, will be advised in a following bulletin.

**Spartanburg Tree Inventory** Our club has worked with the city in completing a street tree inventory. This program was underwritten by a Federal grant. Jack Turner and several of his USCS students were key workers in this project. Bob Powell, Gibbes Patton, and Tom Bartram assisted. It is hoped that this program will be followed by Federal Grants for street trees.

Tree Bank Operations The city contributed some extensive grading and ditching to greatly improve drainage at the tree bank last Fall. In turn more leaf mold is being distributed and rotatilled into the soil preparing planting of the current lot of dogwoods (white). In a first trip to the State Tree Bank at Salem, S.C., four thousand 2 year old treelets were picked up. Our club is also cooperating with the Spartanburg Board of Realtors in supply of trees for their distribution program. A big **Thank You** to members who are helping Harold Hatcher at the tree bank. Take a turn; you will enjoy it.


