Kudzu Coalition News

One of the most exciting programs supported by the Men's Garden Club is the Kudzu Coalition, headed up by member Newt Hardy. This group has formed a Board of Directions, with the approval of the MGC Board, and is continuing the good work you've seen around Spartanburg and moving on to other areas. In an effort to increase their volunteer base (all MGC members are invited to become Kudzu Warriors), the group has reached out to local high schools with great success. Currently they are working with students from four area schools and have applied for a grant from the Fish and Wildlife Department that, if they are successful with their application, will allow them to expand their efforts to 15 high schools and some middle schools. They are also planning to extend their attack on kudzu through the formation of a sister organization in a neighboring community in the near future. Plans are being made for a "Kudzu Kapers" event in the spring that will bring all the high school students together

for a day of fun and celebration honoring their efforts. Juanitta Baldwin, a writer who has published several books on kudzu, is sponsoring cash awards for an art and writing contest for high school students that will be coordinated by the Kudzu Coalition. Look for continued publicity on their efforts in the local paper. And do consider attending a kudzu "party"! Check out the website at http://www.kokudzu.com for times and places.

Club By-Laws Revision

The By-Laws Revision Committee has completed its work and presented a report to the Board. The final version of the proposed by-laws will be presented to the membership for approval at the February meeting. A great deal of work has gone into preparing workable by-laws that will direct the growth and development of the club for years to come. Plan to be at the February 19th meeting for this most important presentation.

Business 85 Treescaping

Henry Pittman reports that the 7.3 mile shoulder treescape project is underway. Staking of the plant locations is currently being done and planting should be completed within the month. This project is funded with federal funds with MGC providing the matching funds. Roebuck Wholesale Nursery has received the contract for the planting, one-year warranty and establishment period. The Spot of Pride organization will provide on-going maintenance for these trees after the first year.

Youth Committee Activities

The Youth Committee sponsored Project Learning Tree at Hatcher Garden for 2006-2007. These one-hour programs are produced by the Watershed Ecology Center of USC-Upstate and use the garden as a "window on the world" to increase students' understanding of our environment, stimulate their creative and critical thinking and help students develop the ability to make informed decisions on environmental issues. This program strives to instill in students the commitment to take responsible action on behalf of the environment. When the program is completed in April, approximately 530 3rd and 4th grade students will have benefited from this opportunity.

Program: Presentation, Discussion, Review, and consideration by the membership of adopting new by-laws for our Club. Linda McHam, Don Crowder and others, with legal advice from Art McQueen, drafted new by-laws, which have been reviewed in considerable detail by your Board of Directors, and now are offered for membership approval. The proposal has been mailed to our membership – bring your copy to the meeting.

Container Garden – Our container growing program can well be termed the "heart" of our Club, since it is the source of the funds which we rely on for our various civic beautification projects. The program has evolved over many years from growing dogwood seedlings and crape myrtle cuttings in various open areas around town to its present system of purchasing bare root plants from various nurseries, potting them in small containers, and developing the plants to saleable sizes at the garden area, now a corner area within Hatcher Garden and Woodland Preserve. Planning for each year's production and our sales has been an ongoing effort of our Board of Directors, with considerable success, but with plenty of room for a more orderly approach.

And, now come two new brooms with a penchant for orderliness:

Container Gardening co-chairs, Dianne Fergusson and Valerie Hare, have provided Board of Director members with a report that calls for the rearrangement of the garden to assure accurate inventory of the stock, plant locations to help sale customers find what they seek, special sales on large older plants, etc. They present a more orderly approach to stocking the Garden with propagated plants, plants purchased from suppliers, and plants from area nurseries on a ready to sell basis. Potting sessions will be planned and scheduled in advance, labelling and weeding sessions will be scheduled as needed. To make our plant sales more effective, orientation sessions will be conducted.

To assist the program, a budget has been established and was approved at the last Director's meeting which provides for items such as more carts, lighting at the potting shed, a cleanup faucet, etc., etc., And, most importantly, a sizeable layout to provide for a thermal transfer printer to be purchased in conjunction with Hatcher Gardens. The printer will provide much improved identification of plants.

Your editor believes our container garden efforts are really getting organized WOW!!

Recent recognition – Hope you've noticed some of the nice things various sources have said about our Club: Linda Cobb's complimentary article in the *Herald* Journal; *Southern Living's* article about our crape myrtle pruning program with beautiful pictures and shots of Stewart Winslow pruning correctly; a gracious letter from Mayor Bill Barnet commenting on plantings at the City's gateways – and particularly the detailed article in the *Herald Journal* describing Henry Pittman's fruitful efforts in arranging the new tree plantings along a seven-mile stretch of business I-85. Makes one feel good!

Litter Pickup – J.T.Clark will lead our efforts Saturday, March 19th, in participating with the Keep Spartanburg Clean program by picking up litter on our assigned Pine Street area. We need volunteers-about a dozen or soto assemble at 8:00AM in the parking lot behind the Chamber of Commerce building. Takes about 1 ½ hours and about one mile of walking and talking.

Club By-Laws Revision

The new by-laws were presented to the membership at the February meeting. Following discussion and some recommended changes, the by-laws were approved by the members. The Club now operates under these new by-laws.

Kudzu Coalition News

The largest student group to date—45 strong—participated in a Kudzu party at Peters Creed Preserve on Feb. 10. Both *Herald-Journal* and the *Spartanburg Herald* ran articles and pictures of the outing. Plans are still on-going for the "Kudzu Kapers" that will be held on Saturday, April 21 at the Magnolia Street Train Station. You'll want to plan to come out on that day to see the high school students in action as well as to hear the speakers and witness the awards ceremony for the first annual kudzu art and writing contests. And do consider attending a kudzu "party"! Check http://www.kokudzu.com for times and places.

Publicity Committee

The committee is already at work to continue to publicize the work that former chair, Henry Pittman, has done for several years. Their first task is the plant sale, and they're off to a good start with plans for flyers, cards, a plant raffle at the sale and many other ideas. The Board approved a budget line of \$100 for publicizing the April sale.

Container Garden/Plant Sale Committee

A work session on February 24 resulted in the completion of the inventory of our current plant holdings and the arrangement of those plants in the nursery. We've left space for the nursery stock that we are purchasing for the April 28 plant sale. We'll have information on volunteers needed for the sale at the March 19th

meeting. We would like to have as many of the Club members who can assist with the sale on the 28th of April. Specific job descriptions will be available at the March meeting. The label printer that the Club purchased in conjunction with Hatcher Garden is in and installed in the Hatcher office. We'll be using this label printer to produce professional-looking, permanent labels for our plants. Plants have been ordered for the fall sale, and a potting session will be scheduled when the plants arrive.

Hatcher Garden

The Board voted to approve a \$1,500 donation to assist Hatcher Garden with the Tree Inventory Project primarily funded by a grant from the SC Forestry Commission. This project will purchase software to enable the staff to undertake a tree inventory and develop an assessment-based management plan for the tree collection. The final product, which should be completed in July, 2007, will include a base inventory of trees, a representation on a map (that will be available on the website), and a management plan that will include a hazard component, inventory assessment, removal/acquisition recommendations and a yearly management plan. Club members have already volunteered with this project and their on-going participation will be necessary for its success.

Street Tree Committee

A work session was held on March 10 to do light pruning and fertilizing of selected trees. This committee continues to follow up with Sodfathers concerning US221 project. The Business 85 planting has been completed, and some trees may have to be relocated due to active billboards. The committee will work with DOT to achieve a final resolution of this concern.

Litter Pick-up Committee

A clean-up session is scheduled for March 17 beginning at 8:00 to clean up the Club's designated area between Wade's and the Chamber of Commerce on Pine Street.

Incentive Committee

This committee has been charged with developing a system for recognizing Club members who do exemplary work in support of the Club's objectives. They will be working to identify volunteer activities for recognition, to develop an accounting system for volunteer time, and developing ways and means of publicly recognizing individuals who do exemplary volunteer work.



VOLUNTEER RECOGNITION PROGRAM

The SMGC (Club) has implemented a program to publicly recognize members that do exemplary volunteer work in support of the objectives set forth in Article II of Club bylaws.

This paper summarizes that program and includes information about sanctioned and non-sanctioned volunteer activities and volunteer milestones. An example Volunteer-Work Record is also provided.

1. SANCTIONED AND NON-SANCTIONED VOLUNTEER ACTIVITIES:

- A. Sanctioned Activities: The following activities are sanctioned for inclusion in the records of volunteer work:
 - Participation in activities sponsored by one of the Club's standing or ad hoc committees.
 - Activities in support of horticultural beautification and improvement of public-school grounds, parks, public roads, and other similar public property.
 - Activities in support of horticultural beautification and improvement of church grounds and other properties owned by not-for-profit organizations.
 - Volunteer activities in support of Hatcher Garden and other public gardens.
 - Volunteer activities sanctioned by the local chapter of the Master Gardeners, including volunteer activities required for Master-Gardener certification.
 - Teaching and disseminating horticultural science to Club members and others. (When not compensated for activity.)
- B. Non-Sanctioned Activities: The following activities are not sanctioned for inclusion in records of volunteer work:
 - Attendance at regular Club meetings.
 - Attendance at regular board meetings.
 - Activities of officers and directors of the Club in performance of duties of their elected positions.
 - Participating as a student in horticultural training/education.
 - Horticultural activities related to beautification or improvement of privatelyowned land.

2. VOLUNTEER MILESTONES

- A. Volunteer activities will be recognized during a regular-Club meeting in accordance with the following schedule:
 - 1st Level of Recognition: 50 hours of volunteer work
 - 2nd Level of Recognition: 100 hours of volunteer work
 - 3rd Level of Recognition: 250 hours of volunteer work
 - 4th Level of Recognition: 500 hours of volunteer work
 - 5th Level of Recognition: 750 hours of volunteer work
 - 6th Level of Recognition: 1000 hours of volunteer work

3. RECORDING VOLUNTEER HOURS:

- A. General: Volunteer hours will be recorded on a cumulative basis, not on a calendar basis. (Hours of volunteer work recorded during prior years will be added to hours recorded during current and subsequent years.)
- B. Date of Commencement: Volunteer hours completed prior to January 1, 2007 will not be recorded.
- C. Travel Time: Roundtrip-travel time is to be counted in hours-of-volunteer work.

D. Records:

- Each individual is responsible for documenting his/her hours of volunteer work. Records should include the following elements:
 - a. Date of volunteer activity
 - b. Description of volunteer activity
 - c. Hours of activity, including roundtrip travel time
- The attached "Volunteer-Work Record" form should be used to record volunteer activities and--upon completion of each Level of Recognition described in the Article above entitled "Volunteer Milestones"--those records should be submitted to the Recognition Committee member indicated on that form.
- Upon completion of each "Volunteer Milestone," the achievement will be publicly recognized during the next regular Club meeting. Recognition will include presentation of a memento appropriate to the occasion.
