

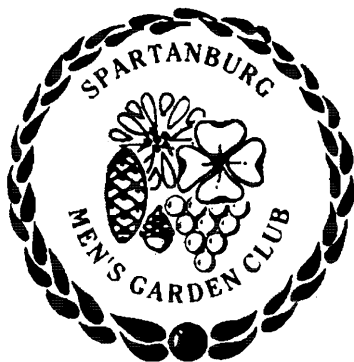

Meeting: Monday, January 16, 2006 7:00 PM

Place: The Arts Center, 385 Spring Street, Spartanburg SC

Program: 2006 discussion: plans and committee assignments.

PLEASE NOTE – After careful review late last year, it was decided to return to the Arts Center as our meeting place.

Plans for 2006 – Our President, Everette Lineberger, prepared and posted a letter to civic leaders and firms outlining our accomplishments during the last year and noting our plans for 2006 – with special emphasis on the National Convention we are hosting this coming April.

At our meeting, you are asked to participate in outlining specific plans for the new year. Committee Chairs are each asked to present a two-minute overview of purposes and plans of his or her committee. A passout will be available indicating committee chairs as well as individuals currently assigned to each committee. New members and any who are not currently assigned are asked to volunteer for participation on committees of their choice.

Container Garden – We had our best year ever for our container garden project, with successful Spring and Fall sales. We have a considerable amount of stock carried forward to this year, and have ordered some 650 bare root plants of many persuasions which are to be delivered within the next two weeks. This will entail one or two major potting sessions – and we are also in need of upgrading about 100 plants to three gallon containers. **A re-potting session will be held this Saturday AM (January 14th) for these upgrades.**

Plans are for Saturday sessions the next two weeks – and then see where we stand. How about planning to participate? Signup clip boards will be available at the meeting. We'll hear more from Harold Wolfe, J.T. Clark, or David Kyle at our meeting. Also, at our recent Directors' meeting, Tasso Ghionis suggested that we should have more sessions on hardwood cuttings during these winter months to increase our future inventories of

easy to do plants - like crape myrtle and buddleia.

Street Trees and associated plantings – We're planning to plant landscape trees at the new Building on Faith House Habitat home, including some trees on the adjoining street. The tree committee is planning some plantings at the Miracle Hill Mission on St. John's Street. Also, we're considering a general pruning and fertilizing session.

At our Directors' meeting we discussed seeking help from Duke Power in planting "second generation" trees between some of the willow oaks on East Main Street. These beautiful trees have grown to large size and soon some will have to undergo major surgery. By planting new trees of smaller species in the same row and giving them a few year's headstart, perhaps we can maintain the attractive appearance when the original trees have to be removed.

National Convention – A January planning meeting was held early this week to cover a myriad of details. The registration form is complete, and new member Lou Adams has done a great job in preparing a complex database for handling all registration details. An important deadline is that National's newsletter which will concern the Convention has a February 1st cut-off date. Everette Lineberger has firmed-up a schedule of seminar topics. Things are apparently reasonably well on schedule. Your committee asks that all members keep the April 20-22 dates clear on their calendars. We will need all the hands we can muster. Why not ask friends to help? Who knows, we may get even more new members!!

Miscellany – The January meeting refreshments will be presented by Linda McHam and Don Crowder...Members should ignore the renewal form on Lineberger's year-end letter if they previously renewed. A few have managed to pay twice for this year. But if you have not renewed, Pay!

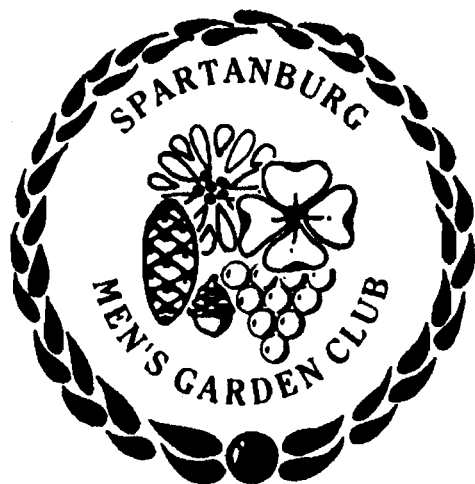

Meeting: Monday, February 20, 2006 7:00 PM
Place: The Arts Center, 385 Spring St. Spartanburg, SC
Program: **National Convention planning** – Our Co-Chairs for this April's big event, Linda McHam and Don Crowder, will lead a discussion of where we stand in preparations and outline areas where help is needed. At the meeting, each steering committee member will be asked to present two minutes worth of information on their committee and then solicit any help needed from the membership. The more volunteers the better - even non-members you can recruit.. Also, registration forms will be available for local paid members so you can join the convention for lunch and dinner. We need full participation to assure success, so attend this meeting for sure and find out what role you can have in our efforts.

AND, back at the ranch, activity at the **Container Garden** proceeds. The large 650 bare-root supply of new stock has been reduced to 150 by two work sessions at the Garden. On Wednesday Feb. 1st, nine stalwarts showed, and on Saturday the 4th, fourteen showed – Nine of them from the Master Gardener program. That day's potting work was suspended when the supply of potting material was exhausted, but the group did a fine job of lining up our stash of plants so they look great.

Don Watson (blimpie), a most helpful non-member, is contributing a new supply of potting soil which will suffice for the balance of the stock to be planted.

Organizer Valerie Hare says that the final day for this first big effort of bare-root plant material potting for this year will be this coming **Saturday, February 18th**. She hopes that in addition to the small cadre of stalwarts we can get a few newcomers out to assist. Try it! A morning at Hatcher can be a pleasant experience.

Tree Planting Programs – About a dozen of the sizeable trees in three-gallon pots we donated to the School for the Deaf and Blind were to be planted last week; the plans for planting at the Habitat House are awaiting grading to be completed. Our trees will be enhanced by shrubs donated by Carolina Garden World. The plans for help in landscaping at Miracle Hill have yet to be set.

We are still waiting for the SC Dept. of Transportation to act on our proposed plans for Business I-85 - they seem to be generally behind on considering and approving or rejecting submitted plans. A meeting with Duke Power about inter-planting second generation willow oaks on East Main St. is scheduled his week.

Tree chairman Henry Pittman plans to organize a twenty-member working

sizeable crew soon for fertilizing and pruning at a number of our recent planting sites.

Nominating Committee – Jim Bagwell, chair of this committee, asks that any member who wishes to make recommendations as to future Board members or officers contact him.

Kudzu Coalition – Newt Hardie recommends that you drive by the area behind the YMCA and view the experimental site where Larry Nelson's sheeting project is at work. Also, he reports that an anonymous donor has offered to fund cleaning up the area the City has termed the worst kudzu invasion, which is located on Marion Avenue.

Scholarship Program – Tasso Ghionis, aided by Linda McHam and Don Crowder, interviewed five applicants for the program – four from Spartanburg Tech and one from Clemson - and were quite impressed with each of them. While we await the results of their applications to National for scholarships, your Board voted to award each applicant \$250 from our Club. It looks as if this is the first successful program in many years.

Landscape Evaluation Program – Bob Almond, Mike Georgian, Bob Hamilton and Terrie Rourke are planning this annual event early this year – tentatively on April 8th – to precede the National Convention. Keep the date open!

Miscellany – President Everette Lineberger and his wife, Ann, continue to stay near the Mayo Clinic in Florida for Ann's medical treatment. He's available by 'phone, and is assisting in many details of the Convention ...the Harold Hatcher memorial plaque and large granite rock are now at the sculptor's site....Did you see the colorful picture of Mike Georgian with his Japanese persimmon tree in the *Herald Journal*?...Betty Ball is planning our participation in Hatcher Garden's Mayfest program...We have a new member from Knoxville, Harlan Hanna, a landscape architect, who suggests he will rekindle interest in a Club there....Our Club made a sizeable donation to Hatcher Garden's annual fund – you may also wish to be a supporter....Our Peggy Wilson has been honored by the Chamber of Commerce as Small Business Person of the Year!.... Tasso Ghionis and a helper (I hope) will furnish the refreshments at our meeting.

Meeting: March 20, 2006, 7:00 PM

Place: The Arts Center, 385 Spring St. Spartanburg, SC

Program: Linda Cobb, dedicated, knowledgeable gardener and writer whose home property suffered serious fire damage last year, will tell us how the fire changed everything. She's hard at work on her renewed garden, and views it as if it were the mythical bird Phoenix who was consumed by fire and then a new vibrant young Phoenix sprang from the ashes.

National convention plans – Last week a meeting was conducted by Linda McHam and Don Crowder to review plans committee by committee, and it appears we've still have much to do, but we're reasonably on schedule. More at the meeting. Note that this bulletin contains a registration form for members attending the convention – please consider signing up and attending!

Container Garden – Harold Wolfe and Valerie Hare have the Garden well under control. Valerie organized a planting session two weeks ago and seven members potted some 200-250 plants remaining from our original large order. Harold has worked days at the garden potting and generally straightening up. Jeff Hall has helped the looks of the area with new gravel and mulch. All looks “go” for the upcoming Spring sale.

Adopt –A-Highway program – Our scheduled pickup on West Main St. is 9:00 AM Saturday March 18 – meet at the Chamber of Commerce parking lot. This is one of our Club's regular commitments – and It's not as bad as it sounds – good exercise and fellowship. Please try it! Henry Pittman will head up this session, and Jim Bagwell has “re-upped” to serve as future leader.

Mayfest – We plan to participate in this activity of Hatcher Gardens which will be held May 20th. Various booths and exhibits will be presented by suppliers and garden clubs, including ours. A petting zoo will be featured. Betty Ball will manage our booth – and needs a few helpers.

North Pine beautification project – Stewart Winslow, Horticulture Director at Milliken, is to direct work on a sizeable beautification project along the creek banks below the old K-Mart site. Some of the support for this comes from the Noble Tree Foundation. Sounds great, since this area has been an eyesore for years.

New tree supply – Frank Stewart and his wife offered their large supply of various trees and shrubs to help Habitat for Humanity – who called us to help evaluate the situation. Harold Wolfe, Henry Pittman, Jess Taylor along with retired Converse botanist Bob Powell inventoried the lot, and most plants were moved to Habitat's new South Pine St. headquarters. Some of the stock will be used at Faith House, some at future Habitat for Humanity homes. Newt Hardie's kudzu program will receive a number of silver maples for a kudzu shading test. Eventually, the balance of the collection will become part of our inventory at Hatcher Gardens.

Landscape Evaluation Program – Our program in conjunction with the area Chamber of Commerce will be held April 8th – 8:30 AM. We met with William Blair, interim head of the Chamber, who informs us that the Chamber plans to really push this event this Spring. They have a new brochure prepared outlining the program, and are appealing to their members for additional entrants. Additionally, new trophies are to be awarded to best landscapes participants. These efforts will surely put a strain on our Club to supply sufficient evaluators for our tours. We need additional sign-ups for this program to augment those who signed up at the last meeting- no experience needed. Please call Terrie Rourke (574-6354) to register as a participant.

Miscellany - Our memorial to Harold Hatcher is on schedule to be sited in Hatcher Garden before the convention.....The Episcopal Church of the Advent is donating some oak trees for our nursery.....Our May program will be a talk on hydrangeas by Sandra Walden....Our Club has received outstanding publicity in the *Spartanburg Magazine* and will have coverage in the next issue of *The American Gardener*--just in time for the convention... 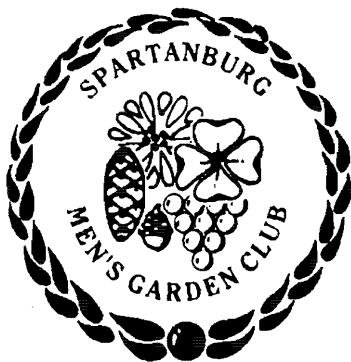

Place: The Arts Center, 385 Spring St., Spartanburg, SC.

Program: **Jenny Osterman**, Executive Director, Spartanburg Nutrition Council. Her talk will concern plants for best nutrition. She will also tell us the plans for the new Farmers Market at the railway station, a project organized by the Nutrition Council.

Spring Plant sale – Our annual major fund raiser, held in conjunction with Hatcher Garden, is scheduled after the convention on Saturday, April 29th. The container garden is full and the variety outstanding – perhaps the best yet. 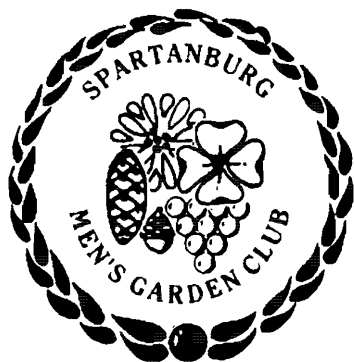

Our speakers and discussion leaders were great, climaxing in Saturday's dinner with Mr. Milliken and the highly entertaining Dr. Mike Dirr. -- **Many should pat their own backs for this success.**

Spring Plant Sale – Thanks to Harold Wolfe's efforts, J. T. Clark's assistance – and the work of quite a few volunteers, the Garden was in great shape for the sale – the largest display ever, and with unusual variety. While rain was predicted, it held off, and the crowd of customers arrived early and seemed to almost overwhelm us at times. More than 25 members helped – talking with customers, taking orders, and aiding with moving plants and cars through the Garden area. When all was said and done, the bottom line is that we had the second most profitable sale ever, under the amount posted in 2005, but still an amount which will keep our treasury in reasonable shape. Hatcher Garden, with its sale of perennial and annual flowers, also had an outstanding display of plants – many grown by Jeff Hall, and had

results similar to ours – a good result, but a less than their best year.

At our Director's meeting after the sale, we discussed various options of using some of our still large plant supply to aid local secondary schools and to seek good homes for some of the remaining unclaimed large trees.

A signup board will be passed at the meeting for a crew to tidy up after the sale and also for some repotting and weeding. Onward and upward.

Landscape Evaluation Program – The windup of another successful program in conjunction with the Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce was a late afternoon session at the Chamber offices May 2d. Attendance was great, packing the main meeting room, with many of the 47 participating organizations represented. All received awards of at least "honorable mention", as the scores indicated 29 had scores of 90 or better. Eight from our Club attended the reception. Bob Almond presented a slide show, quickly reviewing almost a hundred attractive slides of bright greenery and attractive arboreal vistas.

The reception following the presentation was quite lavish – which we understand was underwritten by Morton and Co., a constructor of elder care facilities.

Scholarship Program – At the convention we celebrated the windup of this year's scholarship program which had several firsts: A National award to Clemson's Matt Cousins presented before the convention, and four awards from our Club to Spartanburg Tech students Tyler Crocker, Daniel Devoe, Mike Hardin, and Nathan Rogers. Program: **Ricky McAbee**, owner of Roebuck Nurseries and long time knowledgeable purveyor of trees and shrubs will talk to us about trees.

Annual Fall Plant Sale – This sale is our “big one” on which we depend for the principal portion of our annual income. The results allow us to continue our community beautification efforts for the coming year. This year we are again having a one- day grand event on the same day, Saturday October 21st, as Hatcher Gardens’ sale of perennial plants.

Our advertising flyer has been widely distributed telling of the 150 varieties of trees and plants available. We expect some radio and newspaper mentions of the sale, and we’ve joined with Hatcher in targeting special advertising in the Boiling Springs area.

Anyone delivering additional plants for the sale should contact Don Crowder to assure proper record keeping and placement.

Program: Mark Scott, Spartanburg's City Manager, will be our speaker informing us of new City developments. Mark became our City Manager a year ago having previously served as City Manager of Beverly Hills Ca. for fourteen years. Mark and his wife, Carol, have two busy adult children.

Fall Plant Sale – Our one-day fall sale on Saturday, October 21st, was reasonably successful. The weather cooperated, and we had a lively crowd.
