



Garden Myths Things That We 'Know' That Are Not True

MYTH...Compost tea is more effective than traditional compost.

FACT...There is no evidence to suggest that compost tea works any better than just adding your compost in its normal state to your soil. In fact, leaving barrels of "tea" around to ferment could actually create a breeding ground for E coli and other bacteria. MYTH...Plants under stress should be fertilized. FACT...Horticulturists advise that fertilizing plants that are not deficient in nutrients, can actually add to to existing stress levels. plants are stressed by heat, disease, faulty planting, or lack of space

MYTH...Young trees need stakes.

FACT...Saplings should be staked for only one year, and then have the stakes removed to encourage the tree to be strong and stable on its on.

MYTH...Water droplets and sunshine lead to burnt leaves.

FACT...Water droplets will not damage leaves because the droplets are too close to the leaves to magnify and cause burning.

MYTH...Sand added to clay will make it looser and better for plants.

FACT...However. water runoff will pool in the sand and not be absorbed by the clay causing the plant to drown. Also. Clay and sand make good bricks.

MYTH...Adding compost or potting soil to the planting hole is beneficial to the plant. FACT...This encourages the plants only to grow roots in the rich soil in the planting hole rather than spreading outside the hole.

MYTH... Use gravel or shards in the bottom of a planting container.

FACT...This takes away space for the roots to grow and the water will sit above the gravel and saturate the roots.

Note: Your board of directors has proposed the following change in our by-laws.

Proposed change in SMGC by-laws

Article V

Board of Directors Section 1: Board of Directors

The Board shall consist of the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer and six to 12 Directors. All shall be active members in good standing, who, by their consent, are expected to assume positions of leadership and attend meetings consistently.

The immediate past president is a voting member of the current Board who serves for a term of one year and then must rotate off the Board for at least one year: Section 2: Directors

The Directors shall be elected for a term of two years! half of which will ordinarily be elected each year. Directors must rotate off the Board for a minimum of one year after, they have served two consecutive terms, unless elected as an officer. Section 3: Officers

The officers shall consist of the President, Vice-President, Secretary, and Treasurer (hereafter, the Officers), and shall be elected for a one-year term. The maximum number of consecutive years an officer may serve is six. An officer must rotate off the Board for a minimum of one year after serving six consecutive years.

Article X

Amendments

These Bylaws may be amended or replaced by a two-thirds affirmative vote of the qualified voters present at a membership meeting of the Club, provided the proposed amendment(s) or replacement and notice of the vote have been sent to each active member no later than one month prior to the meeting.

The change is from 2 years to one year as noted in red above.

The voting will take place at the October meeting by secret ballot.

Proposed change in SMGC by-laws

Article V

Board of Directors Section 1: Board of Directors



It's bulb planting time

DIET FOR A SMALL PLANT

One of the best surprises every spring is to discover those bulbs you planted and forgot about - peeking their heads through the soil. One of the greatest dis-appointments is to watch your beautiful bed of bulbs produce fewer and smaller flowers each year.

How do you get daffodils, tulips and hyacinths to bloom luxuriantly every year? We asked Paul Nelson, professor of floriculture at North Carolina State University in Raleigh and author of the publication "Spring-Flowering Bulbs: Trials in North Carolina," for his advice. Nelson says that with fertilization, proper soil preparation and the right varieties, you can have beautiful, long-lasting bulbs in any part of the country - even the South. Growing bulbs is part-icularly tricky in the South, but Nelson's observations will help bulb lovers across the country. His research growing daffodils, tulips and hyacinths in different fertilizers and soils of four years has dispelled many of the bulb mithe that have mered up. We sched him of the bulb myths that have popped up. We asked him to explain.



Diseases such as fusarium bulb rot and botrytis blight are responsible. A common myth believed by southern gardeners is that high spring temperatures cause spring-flowering bulbs to die out after one or two years. However, we found that diseases related to poor soil drainage cause the problem, especially on clay soils. What's the solution to disease problems?

Proper soil preparation encourages aeration of the soil, which inhibits se development. We recommend bulb beds be made 10 to 12 inches deep with disease development. We recommend bulb beds be made 10 to 12 inches deep with at least 1/3 to 1/2 their volume sand or compost. If the soil is hard clay, raised beds may be the best solution.

Should gardeners, even in the South, mulch their bulbs

Yes. We recommend mulching the bulbs with two inches of organic matter yearly in fall. Mulch keeps soil temperatures low in spring so bulbs don't emerge prematurely from the soil and get nipped by a late spring frost. Pine bark, peat moss and wood chips work best. Avoid applying a mulch, such as leaves, that seals out air and water. At planting time water only if the soil is dried out and returned reinfall is not incort is dried out and natural rainfall isn't imminent.

You also say that most gardeners fertilize their bulbs at the wrong time. Why is that?

Many gardeners believe that a bulb lies dormant after the foliage dies from fall until spring. However, in September and October, the roots stop their growth and the shoot begins to grow, continuing until the ground freezes. During the dead of winter the bulb is forming daughter bulbs that will eventually grow into flowering bulbs. In early spring the bulb starts growing again at a tremendous pace until flowering. After flowering the bulb lies dormant until fall.

Traditionally, gardeners apply fertilizer in the spring during and after flowering. All this does is waste fertilizer and pollute the environment. Bulb roots are dying at that time, so they can't take up the fertilizer and it just runs off.

When should you fertilize? The two critical relationships and nitrogen fertilizer provi Also, in the South, warm soils and nitrogen fertilizer provide the perfect environment for fusarium. This disease causes the bulbs to rot.

The two critical times to apply fertilizer around the time you'd be planting bulbs: September to November. In early spring, fertilize about six weeks before bloom time (mid-February in North Carolina) or as soon as you begin to see shoot growth for early flowering bulbs.
